Instead, the association has taken it in stride and found ways to harness technology and adapt to challenging circumstances. The judging for the 2021 awards, for instance, was conducted for the first time online, and is evidence of LIAS' commitment to maintaining the green standards for our City in Nature even amid a pandemic.

In anticipation that some of the future jobs in the landscape industry will be technologically intensive, LIAS has displayed foresight by initiating the Specialist Track under the sector's Progressive Wage Model Career Ladder, which has been endorsed by the Tripartite Cluster for Landscape Industry in January 2021.

To adequately prepare the next generation of landscape professionals, the association has advised the Institute of Technical Education on their curriculum development for the Work-Study Diploma in Arboriculture and Horticulture.

We are confident that LIAS and the landscape industry – a vital cog in the co-management of our island's greenery – will continue to push forward and raise the industry's capabilities and skills. We also look forward to deepening our partnership with LIAS, a partnership that has always been on a forward thrust basis, especially since embarking on NParks' digitalisation launch at the Bishan-Ang Mo Kio Park a year ago. Together, we can nurture a strong and thriving industry, so that Singapore can be further transformed into a greener, more liveable and more sustainable City in Nature for many generations to come.

The landscape sector has begun its sector-wide makeover with the Landscape Sector Transformation Plan (LSTP). To complement this endeavour, the Labour Movement welcomes all landscape companies to partner with NTUC to set up a Company Training Committee (CTC) to scale workforce transformation, and to also tap on the \$70 million that is available with our NTUC CTC grant. This would encompass relevant training needed for landscape maintenance workers to bring about workforce transformation in tandem with firm-level transformation.

NTUC, together with our tripartite partners in the Tripartite Cluster for Landscape (TCL) Industry has also been pushing for better wages and work prospects for landscape maintenance workers. Notably, there were wage enhancements in the Progressive Wage Model for landscape sector from 2023 to 2028 and the inclusion of a Specialist track to recognise the number of growing professionals in the sector, and to attract new and younger entrants to the industry.

We will continue to work together with tripartite partners, including LIAS, to advance the interest of landscape maintenance workers to create better wages, welfare and work prospects, which will in turn translate to better workforce, better productivity and better business outcomes for landscape firms. Every worker matters.

#### ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

LIAS Awards of Excellence 2021 is open to all landscape designers, practitioners, contractors and owners in the landscaping and horticultural industry.

- b. Use "LIAS Awards 2021 Submission Template.pptx" for project presentation detailing the project together with photos (Max 15 images), plans or drawing with description elaboration pertaining to the judging criteria's therein. The final PowerPoint file shall not exceed 50MB.
- c. Upon submission of registration form, a unique registration code reference per entry submission will be issued to the participating companies.
- d. All pictures, plans drawing, and photos used in the PowerPoint shall also be submitted separately and should be at least 300 dpi resolution and not exceeding 5MB per picture/file.

#### JUDGING

**Stage 1, Shortlisting** - A panel of 3 or more judges will score each entry based on the descriptive information and PowerPoint presentations submitted. Entries must score a minimum of 75% to be shortlisted for stage 2 judging.

**Stage 2, On-site Judging** – This is an on-site evaluation by a panel of 3 or more judges. Participants must ensure the availability of site access for on-site judging. Any entries not available for on-site judging on the date stated will be disqualified. However due to the current Covid-19 situation, on-site judging may be replaced with video ((live or pre-recorded) as decided by the e Organiser depends on the Safe Management Measures at that point in time.

A qualified panel of judges will be selected from individuals and professionals involved in or related to the field of landscape, design, architecture, horticulture, floriculture and environment & property / facility management. Participants will be informed by mail of the judges' decision.

And I thank you for your continuous efforts in keeping Singapore green and sustainable.

Singapore's fourth desalination plant, The Keppel Marina East Desalination Plant, is a vital national water-sufficiency infrastructure project that features a lush green rooftop to serve as a communal space and pitstop in Singapore's Park Connector Network. The architecture and landscape design went against the traditional industrial look of preceding desalination plants, featuring a 20,000m<sup>2</sup> open green space atop an oval rooftop that serves as an observation deck for the underground treatment facilities. The green roof reduces energy costs by absorbing heat and providing natural insulation for buildings. Not only that, it reduces and slows down stormwater runoff while filtering pollutants from rainfall. As the rooftop is designed to safely accommodate up to 500 people, citizens are welcome to use the space for recreational activities such as weekend picnics or indulge in panoramic sunset views.

Wetlands rely on natural processes to biologically filter water as it passes through shallow areas of dense aquatic vegetation and permeable bottom soils. The primary mechanisms for nutrient removal is transformation and uptake by microbes and plants, assimilation and absorption into organic and inorganic sediments, and converted into gas through volatilization. Aquatic plants, both above the water and submersed, take up and remove these elements from the sediment and water column into their plant material or biomass. Plants are essential for the proper functioning of ABC Waters design features. Plants help to stabilize swales and batter slopes and maintain the infiltration capacity of the filter media. Ground covers are normally used for vegetated swales and batter slope of bioretention systems to prevent soil erosion. The plants take on a cleansing or treatment function for runoff that improves water quality by absorbing nutrients and other pollutants.




The Springfield Condominium was facing some waterlogging issues at the planter box located at the swimming pool and the design brief was to resolve these issues, including redesigning the entire softscape which benefited the residents that were using the swimming pool. The design strategy was to install drainage cells, geotextile and add in filtered soil mix and compost in order to improve the existing soil which was clayey in nature and caused the waterlogging issue. The planting scheme consists of an informal planting style with differentiated layers and textures which includes colourful and hardy plants such as Schefflera arboricola (cultivar), Tabernaemontana divaricata (dwarf), Rhoeo discolor. Flowering plants such as Heliconia 'American Dwarf', Heliconia psittacorum 'Andromeda' and a mix of vibrant Ixora shrubs such as red, pink, orange and yellow.




NUS SDE commissioned a 153m<sup>2</sup> green wall to create an immersive green corridor along the common walkway to welcome to all visitors to the building.

The 3 main objectives of the green wall create a sustainable bio ladder that is rich in biodiversity; increase intensity in the level of flora and fauna; ensure ease of maintenance of the Greenwall. As such, a rich biodiversity of plants were chosen to create a 'bio-ladder'.

The Greenwall panels have withstood outdoor weather conditions and has continued to thrive despite varying weather patterns. Our landscapers use rope access to descend the Greenwall to prune existing plants and replace dying plants.

The design and maintenance of the Greenwall has also enabled insects to a conducive habitat for the plants to thrive in and we have noticed birds making nests in our greenwall!



Greenology was tasked with creating a modern and artistic interpretation of a cliff face as the center piece for the reception area at Park Royal Marina.

We successfully created an 18 metres tall living green wall in a record time of 1 month, while the hotel was fully in operation!

Guests are greeted by this stunning foliage-covered backdrop at the hotel lobby which acts as a natural air-filtration system, while also helps to reduce ambient noise from the bustling traffic around the hotel. This dreamy vertical garden is topped by a moss scape that mimics clouds, while slender fins resemble soaring tree trunks.

Spanning till the carpark ceiling it is able to be seen as one walks through the school entrance, this green wall is sure to leave an impression as it stands out from its surroundings. The use of different plant species help to create texture and interest to the wall and soften the overall look of the carpark.

Through the use of an irrigation system, the plants are supplied with the required water and nutrients. Ease of maintenance of the system also ensures access within the school will not be restricted for plant care.



Residents and visitors will be welcomed by breath-taking greenery and mid-level sky terraces upon strolling into its communal grounds. The landscape area of green wall covers a total of 252m<sup>2</sup> with an open and long walkway of plants that illuminates the office premise. In an enclosed office space, relying only on indirect natural light shining through the glass panels, the green wall's huge success is a rare sight! The stunning reds are among the reasons why Aglaonema valentine, Caladium bicolour, Anthurium cultivar red were selected.

The quick adaptation and acclimatisation of these plants creates a wonderfully sustainable vertical wall with minimal maintenance requirements.

Nestled in a land parcel that connects Bedok South Avenue 3 and New Upper Changi Road just a stone's throw away from Tanah Merah MRT, Grandeur Park Residences is a residential estate close to the beaches of East Coast Park built upon virgin land. The green wall was implemented whereby residents will be greeted with its different colours and texture variations of plant palette while enfolding the condominium's logo. The green wall filters toxins in the air and converts carbon dioxide to oxygen, hence creating a healthier environment for residents. Darker hue of Schefflera arboricola accompanied by lighter Philodendron erubescens "gold" creates a backdrop in a diagonal geometric pattern. The leafy palette draws an optical illusion of a full tree atop Grandeur Park Residences' logo. Completing the green wall is a metallic frame that contains the green wall in a minimalistic four-sided border.

Waterfall of Plants is designed to be a 12m high green wall, located in the airwell of a residential home, with a moss wall at the top to artistically represent clouds, a waterfall of plants at the middle section to replicate the effect of being immersed in nature and a indoor paludarium at the bottom to simulate a cave like environment.

The hand-sculptured backdrop is designed to imitate a cave setting, together with our plant choice of lush shade-loving plants and a forest-like green wall design. Views of this central column of natural green can be enjoyed by all from their own rooms, and from shared spaces.
